PREPARE FOR WINTER: VACCINATIONS & SELF-CARE TO STAY WELL



The Welsh Government is reminding everyone to protect themselves against common illnesses and support the NHS this winter.

Flu vaccinations for children are underway in schools and the adult flu and Covid-19 vaccination programme began on 1st October.

For the first time, pregnant women in Wales are being offered the RSV vaccine to protect newborn babies from the illness. The vaccine is also being offered to those over 75.

THOUSANDS MISSING OUT ON PENSION CREDIT

The Welsh Government, alongside other support agencies, is running a campaign to encourage more people to claim Pension Credit which could unlock additional financial help.

Approximately 80,000 pensioners in Wales are eligible for Pension Credit but are not claiming it and people are being urged to check their eligibility.

HOME CARE QUARTER-BILLION INVESTMENT TO PREVENT HOSPITAL STAYS

More than a quarter of a billion pounds of Welsh Government investment has helped older people be cared for in their own homes and avoided thousands of unnecessary hospital stays.



- £146.2m invested through the Regional Integration Fund (RIF) to help Regional Partnership Boards provide early intervention and community services.
- £70m into developing community hubs.
- £60.5m to support people who need care, support and rehabilitation to live independently at home.

Services like Care & Repair who helped prevent over 3000 hospital admissions last year across Wales through home adaptations and repairs.

MANDATORY BIRD REGISTRATION NOW IN FORCE: REGISTER NOW!

From 1st October 2024 it has become a legal requirement for all bird keepers in Wales (and England) to register themselves with the Animal and Plant Health Agency (APHA).

Previously, only keepers with 50 or more birds were legally required to register. This new requirement will mean keepers of poultry and other captive birds must register regardless of the size of their flock.

The new requirement will allow us to communicate with bird keepers effectively, which is vital in helping to manage disease outbreaks such as bird flu.

SIGNIFICANT PROGRESS BEING MADE ON FLOOD PREVENTION SCHEMES ACROSS WALES



Flooding has a devastating impact on homes, livelihoods, and people's lives. As winter approaches, many in Wales are increasingly concerned about the safety of their homes and businesses.

The Welsh Government is committed to safeguarding our communities from the catastrophic consequences of flooding and coastal erosion and continues to invest heavily in coastal defense infrastructure and flood defense work, with multi-million pound investments to protect our towns for the future.

THOUSANDS OF WELSH FARMS RECEIVE BPS ADVANCE PAYMENTS

£157.8m has been paid to over 15,500 Welsh farm businesses as Basic Payment Scheme (BPS) 2024 advance payments are made.

More than 96% of claimants received a BPS advance on 14th October, worth approximately 70% of their estimated claim value.

Rural Payments Wales is committed to making the remaining balance payments as soon as possible, with the payment window opening in December.


